
# The Governor's Briefing to the House Finance Committee

## Budget Overview

What Are the Budget's Objectives?

- Maintains strong reserves; preserves Rainy Day fund
- Budgets for our wildfire recovery costs
- Invests in disaster preparation and climate adaptation
- Converts certain general funded projects to bonds to free up cash for fire recovery while giving projects a longer implementation period
- Funds priorities in housing, homelessness, healthcare, climate, and education

The wildfire disaster showed us that we need to keep pushing for housing, healthcare, mental health, climate, and much more.

## State Priorities

- Disaster preparation, fire response, and recovery
- Climate and Environment
- Housing, Homelessness, and Infrastructure
- Health care and Mental Health
- Education



## Upcoming Legislative Proposals

Administration package of legislative proposals will be submitted on January 22, 2024

#### Key Items will include:

- Additional **fire recovery items** including establishing a fire marshal
- New Phases of the **Green Affordability Plan** to lower cost of living for Hawaii residents
- A **Green Impact Fee** (visitor impact fee) to support restoration of our natural resources



## Disaster Preparation, Fire Response, and Recovery



- \$20M in general funds to Hawaiian Home Lands wildfire recovery and preventative measures, including fire breaks and development of water resources
- \$17.4M in general funds to Dept of Land and Natural Resources:
  - **\$7.4M** for statewide wildfire response, prevention and suppression
  - \$10M for emergency response equipment
- 20 positions and \$653k in general funds for brushfire positions for HIEMA.

## Supporting Maui

- \$13.3M in general funds and \$12.7M in federal funds for Disaster Case

  Management Services to those displaced by Maui wildfires
- \$2.4M in GO bonds for fire prevention and erosion control in West and upcountry Maui and fire suppression dip tanks on Maui (DLNR)
- **\$6.6M** in revenue bonds and **\$26.4M** in federal funds for major repairs, rehabilitation, and reinstallation of State highway facilities in Lahaina



#### Climate and Environment



- \$7.5M in general funds to Dept of Land and Natural Resources to improve forest resource management practices for fire-resilient landscapes
- 3.00 positions and \$154k in general funds for the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission
- 3.00 positions and \$388k in special funds and \$430k in federal funds for Solar for All Grant and for Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority Operations
- **\$2M** in special funds for equipment and motor vehicles to support State Parks

### Infrastructure, Housing, and Homelessness

- \$22M in GO bonds for HPHA elderly housing along School Street
- \$10M in GO bonds for public housing statewide health and safety improvements
- \$25M in GO Bonds for infrastructure near UH West Oahu in Kapolei
- \$10M in GO Bonds for housing supportive infrastructure in the Iwilei-Kapalama area
- \$400k in general funds for the State Rent supplement program to assist low-income households in affording rent



#### Investments in Mental Health



- \$20M for psychiatric in-patient services and \$13M in general funds for *locum tenen* services at the Hawaii State Hospital
- **\$6.7M** in general funds for Behavioral Health Crisis Center at Iwilei Resource Center
- \$10.8M in general funds for child and adolescent mental health services
- \$400k in general funds to train DOE personnel in trauma-informed practices

#### Health Care Access

- \$500k in general funds for vision screening and glasses for students at DOE schools
- \$4.9M in general funds for early intervention services for Family Health Services division
- \$25M in GO bonds for Hawai'i Health System repairs across the state
- \$3M in general funds to UH to expand opportunities for healthcare research and training, mental health services across all campuses, and funding for pre-nursing and counseling programs to address healthcare provider shortages



#### Education



- \$64M in general funds for core DOE services, including food services, student transportation, workers' compensation and utilities
- \$1.3M in general funds for special education speech language pathology services
- \$2.7M in general funds to hire more applied behavioral analysts to support students with significant behavioral needs
- \* \$18M in general funds for safety measures across all schools
- \$17M in general funds to restore University of Hawaii funding to pre-pandemic levels
