HB	SB	Title	Description
HB100	SB210	RELATING TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA SHARING.	Establishes a criminal justice data sharing working group to make recommendations for a statewide criminal justice data repository.
HB101	SB211	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.	Clarifies that service and compensation awarded as part of an administrative, arbitral, or judicial proceeding are included in the calculation of retirement benefits and service time for the Employees' Retirement System.
HB102	SB212	RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS.	Provides that a person having professional-level government employment performing lawful experience in review of engineered plans and calculations under the direct supervision of an applicably licensed engineer is eligible for licensure as a professional engineer.
HB103	SB213	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.	Allows departments and agencies time to comply with Employees' Retirement System reporting standards based on when final specifications are provided by the Employees' Retirement System.
HB104	SB214	RELATING TO PUBLIC TRANSIT.	Establishes the offense of interference with the operation of a public transit vehicle.
HB105	SB215	RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES.	Requires license plates to include okinas. Authorizes the use of all uppercase letters, all lowercase letters, or initial capital letters in license plates.
HB106	SB216	RELATING TO THE COUNTIES.	Authorizes a county to proceed with a power of sale on real property subject to a recorded lien.

HB107	SB217	RELATING TO RENEWAL OF DRIVER'S LICENSES.	Authorizes the renewal of driver's licenses online or by electronic or digital means.
HB109	SB219	RELATING TO COUNTY ZONING.	Clarifies county zoning to explicitly authorize counties to adopt zoning regulations that eliminate or amortize land uses or structures established after the effective date of the first comprehensive zoning ordinance adopted by a county and zoning regulations that restrict the time, place, manner, or duration of a land use activity that do not create different types of land uses by limiting the time, place, manner, or duration of a use of land.
HB110	SB220	RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES.	Authorizes the use of diacritical marks for Hawaiian words on special number plates.
HB119	SB234	RELATING TO FIREARMS.	Creates the offense of negligent concealment of a firearm by a licensee.
HB123	SB224	RELATING TO NOISE CONTROL.	Allows for noise control infractions to be processed under the traffic and emergency period infractions adjudication process. Grants the district court concurrent jurisdiction over noise control infractions committed by minors.
