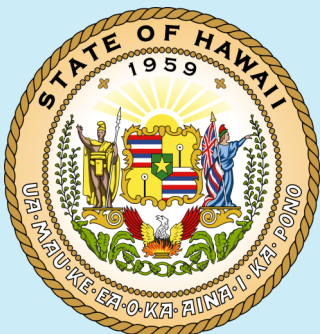

(Above) Representative Chun and Senator Aquino met with various stakeholders regarding the SHADE Institute's plan to develop multimodal pathways along the Waipi'o Point Access Road near Waipahū High School and the Aloha Clubhouse.

SHADE Institute, is a non-profit that has collaborated with local stakeholders, including the Waipahu Aloha Clubhouse, Waipahu High School, and the Waipahu Community Association, to address safety and accessibility concerns since 2016. With the assistance of Ki Concepts and G70's civil engineering and planning group, SHADE developed a preliminary design for the multimodal pathways which the legislature approved funding for in 2022 and the Governor recently released.

SHADE is now moving forward on its Phase 1 to bring better access to Waipahū High School and the Aloha Clubhouse and connecting it to the Pearl Harbor Historic Bike Trail. They hope to continue with several more phases of new pathways around the Waipi'o Peninsula.
