- Summer EBT (SUN Bucks): Receive \$177 per eligible child to help stretch your grocery budget. Apply by August 3.
- Kaukau 4 Keiki: Nutritious meal kits featuring locally sourced fruits, vegetables, proteins, starches, and milk. Applications available online.
- Free On-Site Meals: Access free, nutritious meals for children at various locations across the state. Use the interactive map to find a site near you.


Mililani High School 'Āina Aloha Project

I took a walk over to the DOE Administrative Building, where I had the chance to view a beautiful quilt being displayed that was researched, designed and painted by students from Mililani High School, as part of their 'Āina Aloha science project. Inspired by Queen Lili'uokalani and a quilt she made while imprisoned at 'Iolani Palace, this student-crafted piece beautifully weaves together themes of marine science, Hawaiian history, and political storytelling. Each block in the guilt tells its own mo'olelo (story), highlighting themes such as a celebration of the sea, pivotal historical moments, and the vital ecosystem services our ocean provides. Designed and painted collaboratively by students across class periods, the guilt stands as a powerful, Hawai'i-centric tribute to resilience, unity, and aloha 'āina. I truly enjoyed experiencing this inspiring example of student creativity and collaboration! Mahalo to Superintendent Hayashi for sharing and show casing student artwork!






PROJECT ANNOUNCEMENT: Upcoming Improvements to Kamehameha Highway

I am pleased to share about the Hawai'i Department of Transportation as they move forward with a much-needed resurfacing, repaving, and rehabilitation project along Kamehameha Highway, from Waipahu Street to Ka Uka Boulevard. This project is currently in the design phase and is anticipated to go out to bid in February 2026. I was able to support the additional funding for this project through House Bill 300, Relating to the State Budget, ensuring that we continue to invest in safer and more reliable infrastructure for our communities.

A New Logo For The Hawai'i State Public Library System

The Hawai'i State Public Library System has unveiled a new visual identity inspired by the natural beauty, rich history, and cultural traditions of our islands. Rooted in the spirit of 'ohana, the new design celebrates our state libraries as welcoming, inclusive spaces that connect community, knowledge, and tradition. The logo incorporates traditional Hawaiian patterns and forms the letter "H" to represent both Hawaii and the library system. The blue shape on the left symbolizes the statewide network that links all branches, much like the ocean connects our islands. The colorful triangles on the right represent the six main islands with libraries, each reflecting its island's official flower or plant. Accent colors pay tribute to Ni'ihau and Kaho'olawe. This new design honors Hawai'i's past while embracing its future, just like our public libraries!




