Avian Flu on Oahu

Avian influenza (H5N1) was confirmed in backyard birds on O'ahu on November 15, 2024, and in a wild duck on the North Shore. Wild birds like ducks and geese can carry the virus without showing symptoms, but it can be deadly to poultry such as chickens.

Safety Precautions:

- Do not touch dead birds without gloves.
- · Wash hands thoroughly afterward.
- Report multiple dead or sick birds the Hawai'i Department of Agriculture:
 - Business hours: 808-483-7100
 - o After hours: 808-837-8092
