The past month of the legislative session has been filled with bill hearings and informational briefings. Beyond legislative commitments, addressing community concerns remains a top priority. The legislative crossover has occurred on March 8th and 372 bills from the Senate crossed over to the House of Representatives. Additionally, 374 bills from the House have come to the Senate for further discussion. This gives the public another opportunity to testify on bills before final decision making. 10 Red-Light Cameras Across Urban Honolulu will start issuing fines for speeding

In addition to issuing fines to drivers that run the red-light at these 10 high traffic intersections, fines for speeding will start April 29th. The red-light system will capture a 12 second video of the traffic violation, send the video to HPD for further review, and approved violation will be mailed within 10 days.

Bill Crossover

This legislative session, 372 out of the 1,437 Senate bills introduced have crossed over to be considered by the House.

Here are a few that might be of interest:

SB 438

SB 1324

SB 1216

Bans the construction of hazardous waste facilities near or above significant aquifers and on high-quality farmland.

Repeals all allowable uses of consumer fireworks by minors and increases penalties for their illegal use and sale.

Aims to reduce noise pollution from vehicles by strengthening regulations against noisy mufflers and exhaust systems.
