DeCorte Neighborhood Park Increased Patrols

Regarding community concerns on illegal activity at DeCorte Neighborhood Park, Patrol units CPT and CRU are committed to continually monitoring the park. Sergeant Oato researched the criminal activity history and found that from November 1, 2024 to January 24, 2025, there were four 911 calls for service. In addition to this, two homeless individuals who were at the park have since found permanent housing.

Kamehameha School security is also remaining proactive and utilizing drones to check for illegal activity on the park's hillside. If any illegal activity is detected, they will inform Sergeant Oato. If you see something, say something and call 911.

Senator Kim's Bill Introduction

SB 1203 - Relating to Cognitive Assessments

Requires all health care providers who accept Medicare to provide a cognitive assessment as part of the Medicare Part B annual wellness visit for Medicare beneficiaries sixty-five years of age or older, with certain exceptions.

SB 1544 - Relating to Wireless Communication Devices in Schools

Requires each public school to implement a policy to prohibit students from using cellular phones and other wireless communication devices during school hours, subject to exceptions for education, health, and emergencies.

SB 1545 - Relating to Nepotism

Repeals language in the State's Code of Ethics that exempts the Legislative Branch from prohibitions against nepotism in public employment.
