Representatives Chun and Takenouchi were guest speakers at an American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN) advocacy event. They answered questions about bills from this past legislative session and offered advice on how to approach legislators in the future.



Representatives Chun, Kong, and Takayama; Senators Aquino and Wakai; Councilmember Okimoto; leadership from the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA); the Attorney General's office; and advocates pose with Governor Green in appreciation for his signing of SB2192 Now law, DCCA has the authority to appoint a temporary owner to the Sunset Memorial Cemetery which has been without an owner for over a decade. This is a big step towards much needed maintenance and upkeep for Sunset Memorial.



Senator Moriwaki and Representative Chun, as Co-Conveners of the Kūpuna Caucus, were joined by numerous House and Senate colleagues, alongside representatives from the Alzheimer's Association, AARP, the Department of Law Enforcement, the Department of Health, and other advocates, to witness Governor Green signing SB2305 into law. This legislation establishes a Silver Alert program in Hawai'i, designed to help locate missing individuals aged 65 and older, as well as those with cognitive disabilities, under the direction of the Department of Law Enforcement.
