Bill's Introduced

HB1341 RELATING TO MEDICAID

Appropriates moneys for the achievement of full funding, including estimated payment increases, of Medicaid Home- and Community-Based Services

HB494 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES

Subjects to the rights, responsibilities, and liabilities of transferees under section 286-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, organizations that receive motor vehicles as charitable donations.

HB495 RELATING TO FIREWORKS

Increases fines that may be assessed against certain fireworks related violations.

Majority Caucus Bill Package

HB948: RELATING TO CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH

Establishes a two-year child and adolescent crisis mobile outreach team pilot program on Oahu to expand existing crisis response services.

HB949: RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY

Establishes and appropriates funds for a solar energy storage system loan program to provide asset limited, income constrained, employed households with low-interest loans to purchase and install solar energy storage systems.

HB950: RELATING TO ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT ORDERS

Extends the time period that a family court may order continued assisted community treatment.

HB951: RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCES

Deposits funds into the rental housing revolving fund to be used to provide grants or loans to mixed-income rental projects or units qualifying individuals and families.

HB953: RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Requires DLNR to develop and publish a website that includes the application processes for a permit, license, or reservation needed to conduct recreational and commercial activities in the State that are regulated by or under the jurisdiction of the department.

HB952: RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCES

Appropriate funds to the department of land and natural resources to address the impacts of climate change in the State.

HB954: RELATING TO TAXATION

Changes the amount of the state earned income tax credit to an unspecified percentage of the federal earned income tax credit allowed based on an individual's federal income tax return.

Important Dates

FEB 8th Triple Referral Filing

All bills referred to three or more committees must be filed so that they can be in their second-to-last committee by the following day.

FEB 17th First Lateral

All bills referred to more than one committee must move to their final committee in the originating chamber by this day.

MAR 3rd First Decking Deadline

for bills to emerge from all their committees (with committee reports filed) and be submitted to the clerk of the originating chamber.

MAR 9 – First Crossover

Deadline for bills to pass third reading in order to move (or “crossover”) to the other chamber.
