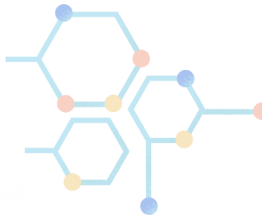

LEGISLATURE AT HALFWAY POINT: BILLS THAT ARE GAINING MOMENTUM

Approximately 30% of all bills introduced successfully cleared the First Crossover deadline on March 1st. Those bills now proceed to the non-originating chamber for further review and approval. You still have ample chances to provide testimonies on significant bills and suggest amendments as they move through the session. Here are some measures we are carefully monitoring that aim to benefit our community in various ways.



HB1827 HD2: RELATING TO HEALTHCARE

Appropriates funds to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and Department of Education to support health care workforce development programs, specifically the Public High School Health Care Workforce Certificate Program and Glidepath Program for Certified Nurse Aides. Appropriates funds to renovate and equip certain public high school classrooms to be used for health care training.



HB2216 HD2: Relating to Care Homes

Increases the cap on state supplemental payments for type I adult residential care homes, licensed developmental disabilities domiciliary homes, community foster homes, certified adult foster homes, and type II adult residential care homes.



HB2215 HD1: Relating to Medicaid

Appropriates funds to increase the funding of certain medicaid homes and community-based services, including adult day programs and residential services offered in community care foster family homes and expanded adult residential care homes. Requires the Department of Human Services to obtain matching funds.



HB1800 HD1: Relating to the State Budget (State Budget House Draft Version)

Modifies and allocates funding within the state budget for the 2023-2025 period, addressing operational needs and capital improvement projects. Notably the Department of Human Services has been allocated **\$15 Million specifically home and community-based services.**

Design, construction, and equipment and appurtenances for whole school renovation (Phase 2); ground and site improvements.

Design and construction for campus-wide security fencing and gates and all related work including new work and refurbishment/repair/renovation; ground and site improvements.

\$1,000,000

Construction for tennis resurfacing project.

\$650,000

Construction for air conditioning repairs.

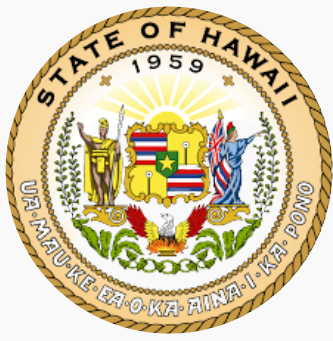
