BILLS INTRODUCED AND RESOURCES

HB176: Relating to Domestic Abuse Protection Order

The law increases penalties for violating a restraining order, prohibits fines if the defendant can't pay, and allows suspension of jail sentences if the defendant stays alcohol- and drug-free, conviction-free, and completes required assessments.

HB186: Relating to Harassment by Stalking

Makes harassment by stalking a class C felony.

HB1283: Relating to Family

Establishes an exemption from mediation in paternity proceedings where there are allegations of domestic abuse. Clarifies the exemption from mediation in divorce proceedings as it relates to domestic abuse.

HB187: Relating to Fireworks

Increases fines that may be assessed against certain fireworks related violations.

Pending Introduction*: Relating to Water Resources

Appropriates general obligation bonds in the sum of \$20,000,000 to the Board of Water Supply for the planning, design, and construction of two monitoring wells.

HB1282: Relating to Certified Caregiver

Lowers the minimum age that a certified caregiver for an adult foster home must be from twenty-one to eighteen.

HB177: Relating to Civil Identification Cards

Makes the issuance or renewal of a civil identification card free of charge.

Criteria for Qualified Exemptions

- Be physically present in Hawai'i for more than <u>9</u> months during the taxable year.
- Not be claimed as a dependent by any taxpayer for federal or Hawai'i individual income tax purposes.
- Not be confined in prison, jail, or youth detention facility for the entire taxable year.
