The Heart of the Community

HCR54 / HR50

This resolution calls on the Department of Law Enforcement to step up efforts in monitoring and enforcing laws against illegal fireworks, especially in public parks and beaches. With a recent rise in firework-related injuries and tragic incidents, stricter oversight is needed to protect public safety and prevent further harm.

HCR55 / HR51

This resolution requests the Judiciary to study how well domestic violence restraining orders and stalking laws work in protecting victims. It will analyze enforcement and effectiveness, gather feedback from key groups, and suggest improvements. The findings will be reported to the Legislature before the 2026 session.

HCR57 / HR53

This resolution urges the Department of Transportation Services in Honolulu to conduct a study on traffic safety around Paiwa Street in Waipahu. The study will evaluate the effectiveness of traffic calming measures like speed bumps, raised crosswalks, and red lights to improve safety and reduce accidents. The findings and recommendations will be reported to the Legislature before the 2026 session.

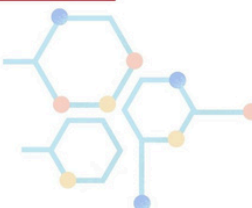
