# CRIME STATISTICS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

The Honolulu Police Department unveiled a new tool on its website to help Oahu residents keep track of crimes happening in their neighborhood.

**Go to: www.honolulupd.org** By clicking on the Crime Mapping link on the department's home page, the public can access information that is updated daily through a fully-automated, computer-aided dispatch system. A person simply enters an address, and a map pops up with the location of each reported incident plotted. There are five categories of crime covered – theft, burglary, auto theft, car break-in, and graffiti.
