#### Hawaii: Next 50 Contest

The Hawaii: Next 50 Contest was inspired by former Governor George Ariyoshi's book, <u>Hawaii: The Past Fifty</u> <u>Years, The Next Fifty Years</u>, which provides a retrospective look into our islands' history as a state and prompts the next generation to think about what social, cultural, and economic roads we can take to keep Hawaii moving forward in the next century.
