Purpose: (1) To create a shared vision for public education in Hawaii (2) To learn about the opportunities provided by the new ESSA law (3) To discuss a future-focused education system for Hawaii, and (4) To collect input, feedback, and advice for a new blueprint for public education in Hawaii.

Hepatitis A Update: Where to Get Vaccinated

On August 15, 2016, the Hawaii State Department of Health (HDOH) identified raw scallops served at Genki Sushi restaurants on Oahu and Kauai as a likely source of the ongoing outbreak. The product of concern is Sea Port Bay Scallops (Wild Harvest, Raw Frozen) that originated in the Philippines (states "Product of the Philippines" on the box), distributed by Koha Oriental Foods and True World Foods. As a result, HDOH ordered this product embargoed (not to be sold, purchased, or consumed) throughout the state, and the temporary closure of all Genki Sushi restaurants on Oahu and Kauai. The scallops received by True World Foods have not been distributed to any restaurants in the state, and were embargoed at their warehouse. The scallops served at Genki locations on the Big Island and Maui originated from a different supplier and have not been associated with the outbreak.

HDOH encourages Hawaii residents to consider getting vaccinated for hepatitis A. Following is a list of places that are offering the hepatitis A vaccine in our community:
