Session Introduction

Aloha family, friends and neighbors!

First and foremost, thank you for electing me to serve as the Representative for House District 2. I am honored and humbled by the privilege of this opportunity to represent you in the Thirty-Third Legislative Session. My eight years on the Hawai'i County Council has proven to be a strong foundation to tackle issues facing the State of Hawai'i, and I am very fortunate to have outstanding staff by my side with years of legislative experience: Isaac Goya—Hilo born-&-raised Legislative Aide who has been a long-time legislative session worker, Soana Tupua-Fanoga—my Office Manager who has worked with many other representatives, Alisha Leisek—my Committee Clerk who comes with an extensive and established background in both the Senate and House, and Kevin Chong—Legislative Aide and an eager learner and future UH Manoa student.

As a freshman member of the State House of Representatives, I was elevated to serve as the Vice Chair on the Committee on Health and as a member of the Humans Services and Homelessness (HSH) Committee. While the subject matter of public health and overall community health is new territory, meeting with experts has made the learning curve a quick transition, and caring for the most vulnerable in our community together with personal lived experience has made the policy work meaningful and rewarding. As a member of the HSH committee, I have seen how the great work I've done on the County Council dovetails nicely with State plans and programs aimed to tackle this area of need and attention.

I have also been tapped by House leadership to serve as a member on the Committee on Finance. Within a few weeks of the new session, UHERO delivered it's 2025 first-quarter forecast and as noted in the report's Executive Summary – "Hawaii's economic growth is threatened by federal disruptions. While tax cuts may provide some stimulus this year, the Administration's actions—including tariffs, mass deportations, and spending cuts—will impose significant drag thereafter." As of this writing, the House passed HB300 HD1 that charts a strong course to tackle the challenging financial headwinds, and supports our communities' needs. These three committee assignments are vital for our island and State to thrive.

Finally, I was also given the opportunity to introduce various pieces of legislation to help Hawai'i Island and the State of Hawaii, from funding for the Mauna Kea scholars program to a bill to help revitalize the Waiakea Peninsula (Banyan Drive). HB 818
