## LIST OF BILLS INTRODUCED BY REP. OKIMOTO

**PM ZIPPER LANE** - HB 890 - This bill would require the Department of Transportation to conduct a study that reevaluates the cost and feasibility of constructing a Zipper Lane along the H-1 freeway in the westbound direction for use during the afternoon hours.

**MILILANI MAUKA INTERCHANGE IMPROVEMENTS** - HB 1387 - Appropriates funds to the Department of Transportation to plan, design, and construct an additional lane and double loop on-ramp southbound from Mililani Mauka with a pedestrian overpass (\$23,000,000).

**TAX CREDIT FOR TEACHERS** - HB 891- Would establish a non-refundable state income tax credit up to \$500 for certain expenses incurred by Pre-K through Grade 12 teachers, librarians, counselors, etc. who purchase items for their classrooms and/or students.

**CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PILOT PROGRAM** - HB 892 - This bill would create a five year pilot program in the Department of Education to encourage students to study career technical education.

**ONLINE EARLY EDUCATION** - HB 1386 - Establishes an online early learning education program within the Department of Education.

**SCIENTIST-TO-TEACHER PATHWAY PROGRAM** - HB 1385 - Would create a pilot program within the Department of Education to recruit, train, support, and retain qualified science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) professionals as Kindergarten through Grade 12 teachers of those subjects.

**MAINTAINING OUR SCHOOLS** - HB 1387 - Appropriates funds to the Department of Education to maintain schools in Mililani (\$9,000,000).

**REFUNDABLE FOOD EXCISE TAX CREDIT** - HB 1226 - This bill adjusts existing income brackets so more working families can qualify for the tax credit.

**JURY DUTY** - HB 1388 - Allows people 70 years of age or older to claim exemption from service as a juror.
