Legislative Updates

Bills, Resolutions, and Committees

- HB943, which appropriates funds to expand crisis intervention by establishing a homeless triage and treatment center, passed through all committees and will be heard on the Senate floor for third reading.
- We held an HSH resolutions hearing where I was able to lead the hearing alongside Chair Marten. Resolutions are recommendations/suggestions for committee members and the general legislative body to take a look at specific topics or interest areas that constituents, organizations, and legislators think need more attention and time. Resolutions can be conversation starters for bills that come down the pipeline in the future.
- Currently, a concourrent resolution I submitted, HCR180, which is "requesting the statewide office on homelessness and housing solutions, department of law enforcement, county homeless coordinators, county law enforcement, and social services providers to work collaboratively and effectively to address homelessness in Hawai'i" was adpoted in the House and will cross over to the Senate.
