PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

August is Pedestrian Safety Month

We have seen a decrease in traffic fatalities in the state of Hawaii from 2022 to 2023 (<u>DoT</u>). In observing pedestrian safety month, we hope to continue this trend and reduce the amount of road accidents.

In accordance with pedestrian safety, "No Right on Red" signs have been installed at the busy junctions of Ala Moana Blvd with Kalakaua Ave, Kahanamoku St, Ena Rd, and Hobron Ln in 2022 to prevent accidents.

DRIVERS

- Drive Distraction Free: Phone down eyes up
- Drive Sober
- Drive the posted speed limit and slow down particularly when around residential neighborhoods, parks, and by schools
- Obey all traffic laws and be prepared to stop for pedestrians at a crosswalk

PEDESTRIANS

- Walk against the flow of traffic, especially if there is no sidewalk.
- Cross where it is safe, legal, and puts you at the place to be seen by a driver.
- When possible, wear clothing that makes you more visible or use a reflective band or blinking light that you can attach to your clothing, bag or purse.

The cost of operating and maintaining a condominium project is funded through regular assessments, often called **maintenance fees**, which the association collects monthly from the owners. These fees must be based on a budget adopted by the board of directors. Maintenance fees cover common expenses, like groundskeeping, trash collection, pool maintenance, and security. Every owner is responsible for paying their share of the common expenses.

It's important to know that maintenance fees generally go up every year, since the cost of utilities, repairs, and other services usually increase.
