#### SAFE AND SOUND WAIKIKI

A collaboration between community groups and law enforcement to enhance patrols, advocate for more effective prosecution and promote environmental design, Safe and Sound Waikiki launched in September of 2022. From 2022 to 2023 the Waikīkī district experienced a staggering 67% reduction in drug & alcohol related crimes, a 35% reduction in robberies, a 32% reduction in burglaries, and a 27% reduction in criminal property damage (compared to 2021-2022).

Last month wrapped up the second year of the program. Here are some of the initial take aways: HPD is engaged in aggressive proactive policing in the district including arresting people with warrants. Kuhio Beach area is much improved at night thanks to park hours by HPD and Night Security. Many repeat offenders have been removed through arrests and prosecution. Much progress has been made but there are challenges ahead including, HPD staffing shortages--the district has 30 fewer officers than in 2018, Geographic restrictions are an underutilized tool to keep offenders out and lastly there is difficulty encouraging those in need to get centralized services. October 13, 2024 Sunday 6:00 AM Lanes Close 10:00 AM Lanes Reopen MORE THAN PINK BY SUSAN G. KOMEN HAWAII. The event is expected to have 3,000 runners/walkers. It will start at Honolulu Marathon Finish Line near Bandstand, to Monsarrat Ave., to Paki Ave., to Kalakaua Ave., end at Honolulu Marathon Finish Line near Bandstand. October 19, 2024 Saturday 3:30 PM Road Closes 6:00 PM Road Reopens **HONOLULU PRIDE PARADE.** This event is expected to have 5,000 marchers, 15 floats, 35 vehicles, & 5 bands. It will start at Atkinson/Ala Moana Blvd., to Ala Moana Blvd., to Kalakaua Ave., to Monsarrat Ave., to end at Queen Kapiolani Park.
