Aloha Neighbors,

The Legislature passed a state construction budget for the next two years that totals more than \$3.4 billion in projects.

The Capital Improvement Projects bill, HB1259 SD1 CD1, was transmitted to the Governor on May 1<sup>st</sup>.

Maui County will receive \$337.4 million. These funds are earmarked for renovations, repairs, and major maintenance to existing facilities, new construction, land acquisition, utility modifications and landscape improvements.

This year, the conference committee focused on and addressed the needs of the Department of Education Title IX mandates, ADA requirements, and the maintenance backlog.

There is a lot of work that needs to get done to continue improving our community.

# **TOWN & UPCOUNTRY UPDATE**

End of 2019 Legislative Session Update

This year, the Legislature used a new budget process which allowed for closer scrutiny and more transparency. Lawmakers passed the executive operating budget, HB2 HD1 SD1 CD1, nearly a month earlier than previous sessions. The bill allocated \$16 billion in operating funds.

HB116 SD1 CD1 is an addendum to HB2. House members had an opportunity to have meaningful discussions on additional critical funding requests through HB116.
