# **TOWN & UPCOUNTRY UPDATE**

June Update 2020



The COVID-19 pandemic has created an unprecedented economic and health crisis across our nation. As a result, our U.S. government instituted the CARES Act. The CARES Act is designed to provide emergency appropriations to hospitals and medical organizations. It also addresses the many needs of States to provide economic relief to businesses and payments to the unemployed through various measures. The Act attempts to stabilize our retail, hospitality, and manufacturing industries. Grants, loans, and regulatory relief are also included.

When our legislature met in May, we addressed the CARES Act for State/Local government funding through SB75 SD2 HD1. The Hawaii distribution of \$1,250,000,000 included funds to the Counties, the Departments of Labor, Health, Human Services, Transportation, Defense, and the Governor's Office.

Maui County was allocated \$66,598,757. This amount is based on a population formula. While federal resources are substantial, they come with limitations. Funds must be used for COVID-19 related expenditures and public health emergencies. Strict guidelines must be adhered to expend funding by December 30, 2020.

At this writing, Part 4 of the CARES Act is currently being deliberated in Congress.
