We are currently wrapping up the Legislative Session for 2021.

One of the largest hurdles this year was tackling the budget. With the assistance of the Federal Government, *The American Rescue Plan Act* helped us to restore funding for needed programs and to prevent further furloughs and potential layoffs. Some programs include the Rent Supplement Program, early intervention programs, and homeless services. As an idea of funding we received from the **ARPA**: The State of Hawaii received \$1.6 billion in federal assistance and the County of Maui received \$30 million in federal assistance.

In district news, the governor recently released funding for the baseball and softball complex that will be built at King Kekaulike High School. We are excited to see the planning and designs for the new facility. We will also receive funding for the expansion and modernization of the Makawao Library. Other projects we received funding for can be found on page 2.

As always, thank you for letting me serve you and our community. My office and I continue to be a resource for you, please let me know if we can be of assistance.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021

Here's a breakdown of a few key provisions in the relief package:

Unemployment Assistance—\$575 million funding

- Available to self-employed individuals, part-time workers, independent contractors, and gig workers, including ride-sharing drivers
- Covers those who are sick, quarantined, furloughed, or whose family circumstances keep them from working or reduce their pay as a result of the coronavirus outbreak or government containment efforts
- Covers salaries up to about \$65,000 through September 6 with an additional \$300 per week
- Makes the first \$10,200 of unemployment benefits collected in 2020 tax free for those households whose income was less than \$150,000

Rent and mortgage relief – Estimated \$226.5 million funding

- \$152 million to Hawaii residents who lost their job/saw significant reduction in income due to pandemic to make rent
 - MEO's Rental Assistance Program: (808)249-2970
- ~\$50 million for a new Homeowner Assistance Program to help Hawai'i families who are behind on their mortgages/already in foreclosure as a result of the pandemic.

Eviction Moratorium for Renters

The CDC further extended the eviction moratorium until **June 30, 2021.** Landlords are prohibited from filing for eviction or charging any fees for unpaid rent and fees during the moratorium and must issue a notice to tenants to vacate 30 days before an eviction once the moratorium ends. After the CDC moratorium period ends, renters will be responsible for making payments.

Renters seeking information on whether they are covered by the moratorium should contact <u>Legal Aid Society of Hawaii</u> or a HUD approved housing counselor. You can find the nearest housing counselor by calling (800) 569-4287.
