#### Accessing the Capitol — Virtually

The Hawaii State Capitol remains closed to the public due to COVID-19 restrictions necessitated by the emergence of COVID variants. However, you can still connect effectively with lawmakers and keep track of what's going on. Use phone calls and emails to reach out to senators and representatives with your views on pieces of legislation. Try to hone your message to summarize your views or your request, and make sure to include the bill number when appropriate.

If you're not aware of the wealth of information available on the legislature's website (<u>capitol.hawaii.gov</u>), give the Public Access Room (PAR) a call and they'll be happy to point out the highlights. The 2022 session will again provide the opportunity to testify remotely, and hearings are being both livestreamed and archived for later viewing.

#### American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Expenditures

The State of Hawai'i was allocated \$1.6 billion from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to address emergency response stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor has allocated all expenditures to support essential government services and to meet the demands of our social safety nets.

- \$11M Maui Health System hospital subsidy
- \$10M COVID-19 test kits
- \$58M Departments of Health and Public Safety to strengthen COVID-19 response

To provide a safety net for those who were without jobs during this time, the Department of Labor & Industrial Relations' Unemployment Insurance Program received a major portion of the ARPA funds of \$870M.

The pandemic shed a light on the need for high speed internet for students and workers. A small amount of \$1.5M was funded for Broadband infrastructure planning. Additional funding through the

### Maui County CIP Funds Released by the Governor

Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) are bond funded critical infrastructure of the State— including highways, schools, airports, and harbors. These funds cannot be used for every day operations like unemployment insurance, general assistance, or other services.

Hale Makua Health Services	Design for expansion of the Kahului campus.	\$200,000
Traffic Operational Improvements, Maui	Improvements to existing intersections and highway facilities on Maui.	\$1,600,000
Watershed Protection and Ungulate Fencing, Maui	Funds for new watershed protection and ungulate fencing to exclude axis deer from priority areas on Maui	\$2,800,000
System, Renew, Improve and Modernize, Statewide	Design and construction to improve University of Hawaii System facilities statewide.	\$51,800,000
CC Capital Renewal and Deferred Maintenance, Statewide	Support ongoing major repair and restoration projects at the Community Colleges, statewide.	\$25,000,000
Maintenance of Facilities, Statewide	Design and construction for improvements and maintenance of public facilities and sites, statewide.	\$19,000,000
