Addressing the Nuts & Bolts of Building Enough Housing to Meet Demand

On November 6, Senator Chang convened a housing conference titled *Kick the Tires: Adapting the Singapore Housing Model to End Hawai'i's Housing Shortage.* The conference brought together public and private sector experts to address some of the most frequently asked questions about whether enough housing can be built to meet Hawai'i's demand for affordable housing.



Singapore is an island nation less than half the size of 'Oahu and over five times the population, yet houses **82 percent** of its population in public housing that costs

only \$180,000 to buy. Hawai'i, by contrast, has experienced a severe housing shortage for decades. A recent state study found that Hawaii needs **65,000 new housing units** by **2025** to meet demand. Senator Chang has proposed the **ALOHA** (Affordable, Locally Owned Homes for All) Homes model, based on Singapore's public housing, to address the housing shortage.

The conference began with a panel of participants in the Singapore housing delegation that Senator Chang led this past May. The second panel, "Infrastructure Needs for Large-Scale Housing Development," covered how Hawai'i can accommodate the water, wastewater, and electricity needs of future residents. The following panels, "How Developers



Finance Large Housing Projects" and "How How to Get a Mortgage on Your New Leasehold Home," covered financing the development of these units and the ability of homebuyers to get mortgages on 99 year lease condominiums. Two construction experts detailed methods to minimize construction costs so that new units can be built for less than \$300,000 during the "How Much Will It Cost" panel.

Our keynote speaker, Professor Phang Sock-Yong of Singapore Management University, joined via videoconference to detail the Singapore public housing program and its changes over the years. Professor Phang is one of the world's preeminent academic experts on Singapore's public housing.

The final panel, "I Live in an HDB Flat: Ask Me Anything," included firsthand experiences of current and former residents of Singapore public housing flats.

Wai'alae Avenue Off-Ramp Improvements

The Department of Transportation has completed work restriping the Wai'alae Avenue off-ramp.

Crews restriped the area to provide space for the extension of the storage lane leading to the Wai'alae off-ramp. Work occurred during the night to avoid traffic congestion, and electronic message boards were posted to notify motorists of the closures.

We would like to thank the hardworking members of the Department of Transportation for their work to make our community safer and more efficient.

Kalani'anaole Highway Intersection Improvements

On November 5, 2019, representatives from the Department of Transportation (DOT) gave a presentation to community members regarding traffic signal improvements along Kalani'anaole Highway. The traffic signal improvements will be at the intersection of Kalani'iki Street / Wai'eli Street and Wa'a Street. The following will be improvements to both intersections:

- Modify curb, gutter, sidewalk, and curb ramps
- Upgrade of median impact attenuators
- Install of new traffic signal equipment
- Install underground duct lines
- Restore the pavement and striping.

The project purpose is to install new traffic signal equipment that meets current State of Hawaii,



Federal, and American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) standards. Work will occur at night, to avoid a disruption of traffic, and is expected to begin in August 2020 and finish in July 2021.
