# Highlighted Bills

### SB 2946 ALOHA Homes

Establishes the ALOHA homes program to develop low-cost homes on stateowned and county-owned land in urban redevelopment sites to be sold in leasehold by the Hawai'i housing finance and development corporation (HHFDC) to qualified residents. Exempts certain land from the definition of public lands. Requires HHFDC to develop an ALOHA homes demonstration project by July 1, 2025.

### SB 2035 Competitive Sealed Bidding

Requires that in evaluating and determining the award for redevelopment of state or county level through competitive sealed bidding or competitive sealed proposals, the number of housing units proposed shall constitute forty per cent of the evaluation score regardless of whether the development of housing is proposed.

### SB 2040 Housing Flipping Surcharge

Establishes a surcharge equal to twenty-five per cent of the net proceeds from the sale of certain residential property within a period of five years after the date of purchase if the owner is ineligible for a county homeowner's exemption on property tax.

### SB 2043 Leasehold Units on State Lands

Authorizes the Hawai'i housing finance and development corporation and Hawai'i community development authority to sell leasehold units in residential condominiums located on state lands.

### SB 2044 Housing Savings Accounts

Establishes the procedures for a housing savings account for all employees in the State.

### SB 2046 Constitutional Amendment to Provide Enough Housing to Meet Demand

Amends the constitution to require the State to provide enough housing to meet demand.

# **Pothole Claims**

The City and State have established phone numbers and websites where anyone can report a pothole. All you needs to do is to report the pothole to the following hotlines with the location of the pothole and jurisdiction:



Potholes can cause a lot of damage, such as a flat tire, cracked wheel, or even body damage. If your car is damaged by a pothole, you can be reimbursed by the City or the State. For claims on roads maintained by the city:

To file a claim, take a photo of the pothole and the damage to your car. The person filing the claim should have the vehicle registration and insurance in their name. At the time of the incident, the person should also call HPD to file a police report. The flier should also send over receipts or invoices of payment for the damages along with the claim. After filing these claims, it may take several months before you receive any reimbursement.

# FOR YOUR INFORMATION

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### SB 2211 Permitting Process 65 Day Shot Clock

Beginning July 1, 2020, requires the State or an appropriate county agency to approve, approve with modification, or disapprove an application for a permit necessary for the development, pre-development, construction, or substantial rehabilitation of a project within sixty-five days of submission. Provides for automatic permit approval if the State or respective county agency does not make a timely decision on the application.

### SB 2216 Empty Homes Tax

Establishes an empty homes tax against certain residential property owners who own a vacant residential unit in the State.

### SB 2202 Predatory Towing

Prevents predatory towing by requiring documented approval authorizing removal of a vehicle from private property by the property owner or a designated representative.

### SB 2210 Right to First Refusal

Authorizes the Hawai'i housing finance and development corporation the right of first refusal for the development of property for all development on state lands that are within a onehalf mile radius of a rail transit station.

### SB 2220 Emergency Shelter for Minors

Expands the circumstances where a minor may consent to no cost emergency shelter and related services to include cases where the provider is coordinating with child welfare services.

### SB 2642 Housing Upzoning

Authorizes the land use commission to govern housing density increases. Authorizes homeowners located in a block to vote to increase the housing density for their respective block. Upon receiving an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the homeowners in a block, requires the land use commission to increase the housing density for the block.

### SB 2645 Aloha Stadium Redevelopment

Requires at least twenty thousand housing units be developed near the rail station nearest to the Aloha Stadium. Requires a minimum of eighty per cent of those housing units to be priced as affordable.

### SB 2649 Helicopter Safety Devices

Amends section 261–12 to require tour aircraft operations permit seekers to have aircraft which are outfitted with FAA approved safety devices.

#### SB 2661 Housing Elements

Requires each county to prepare a housing supply plan to plan for projected increases in the State's housing supply to meet housing demands of the respective county, identify and analyze existing and projected housing needs for all income levels, and identify adequate sites for housing, including rental housing.
