Requires the selected physician to be currently licensed to practice in Hawaii; except that upon approval by the director of labor and industrial relations, a physician in a specialty area who resides outside of the State and is licensed in another state with requirements equivalent to a physician's license may be selected if there is no physician licensed by State in that specialty area is available to conduct the examination. Provides that if the parties are unable to reach a mutual agreement, requires the director of labor and industrial relations to appoint a duly qualified impartial physician to do the examination and make the report to the employer.
