## Capital Improvement Projects

Good news was recently delivered to the citizens of Ka'u, as the \$17.9 million civil defense shelter is soon to be on its way. The very first, FEMA approved civil defense shelter that will be vog-proof, is rumored to be the most expensive capital improvement project in the region. The facility will also double as a gymnasium for the Ka'u High & Pahala Elementary School.

For a moment, even though funds had been appropriated for this shelter back in 2009, this project looked to be doomed as it was prioritized by the State as number 60 out of 64 possible projects. That was until Senator Kahele

and a few of his fellow lawmakers stepped in to tackle this issue. After a couple brainstorming sessions, the plan of attack was to transfer the funds from the State, who had this project very low on its priority list, to the County of Hawai'i, who would be able to take this project on right away. The planned turned out to be a success as the funds were transferred to the County of Hawai'i where planning is now underway.

Another project which is currently in the planning phase is the infrastructure improvements to the Ka'u Irrigation system. The improvements to be made will improve the outlook for viable and sustainable agricultural endeavors in Ka'u. The planning and design phase is currently underway and Senator Kahele will be looking to secure future funding of the actual construction of the project in the upcoming legislative session.

## Community Talk Story Forums

He covered several issues including updates on projects such as the work being done on the Ocean View water well and the extended EIS deadline for the Nani Kahuku Aina project.

Also announced at the community forums was the addition of the medical mobile van which will be coming soon to the Island of Hawai'i. The purpose of this innovative project is to provide healthcare to remote and underserved rural communities. Senator Kahele also hosted an Infrastructure and Transportation Forum on September 22nd. Officials from the State Department of Transportation and the County of Hawai'i Department of Public Works provided updates on projects in the East Hawai'i area.

a particular community. One of the issues brought to the forefront on October 26th at the Pahala Community Center was the Pahala Library closures. Although currently understaffed, the Hawai'i State Public Library System is actively working towards filling the vacant positions and getting the library up and running on a normal schedule.

On a positive note, the Pahala Library will be receiving 24 new laptops and will become a computer hub for the surrounding areas. At this computer hub, community members will be able to participate in the Microsoft IT Academy which provides computer skills that will be beneficial to both students and adults of all ages. For students, this program will take them through relevant technology courses which will assist them in getting jobs after high school. And for adults, it will provide an opportunity to enhance their own professional development while staying current with the new wave of technology.
