New leadership in both the House and Senate brought about many initial changes; however, with combined efforts from both bodies, the Legislature conducted business both efficiently and productively.

The budget deficit we faced this year, forced us to make difficult decisions on the various competing and equally deserving interests of our State. Amongst the numerous initiatives we pursued this session, my colleagues and I worked hard to upgrade our schools, invested \$3 billion in Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) over the biennium, focused on keeping our ports and roads safe and accessible, and most notably we invested in early childhood education and took care of our precious senior citizens.

Although 2013 was a very challenging year at the legislature, I believe we made significant progress and have set a strong foundation for the remainder of the biennium.

Pacific Basin Agricultural Research Center

On April 6, 2013 the USDA Pacific Basin Agricultural Research Center (PBARC) held a special open house event at their facilities in Hilo. On hand was Governor Abercrombie who presented a \$200,000 check from the state Department of Agriculture that will go towards the Hilo centers Zero Waste Biofuel and High Protein Feed program.

PBARC along with BioTork LLC have invested more than \$1M to successfully develop an economically sustainable zero waste conversion project producing biofuel and high protein animal feed from unmarketable papaya.

The state's investment will assist PBARC in moving the project to pilot scale as a prelude to commercial production.

End of Session Legislative Measures

• **SB1221:** Relating to Higher Education; The purpose of this measure is to appropriate \$100K for FY14 to the University of Hawai'i at Hilo to hire a program coordinator and a technical support staff member for an international flight training center and associated aeronautical training programs at UH Hilo and Hawai'i Community College.

• *SB1256: Relating to PISCES;* The purpose of this measure is to appropriate \$400K to the Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems (PISCES) for personnel costs and to support its operations and purchase equipment, which will encourage the development and expansion of the aerospace, robotics, and related industries in Hawai'i.

• *SB106: Relating to Aging;* The purpose of this measure will establish and fund a position for an Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Services coordinator. Appropriates funds for programs and services that support the State's elderly population. Establishes the Task Force on Mobility Management.

• *HB417: Relating to the Hawai'i Health System Corporation;* The purpose of this measure is to address the shortage of primary care providers in the State by appropriating \$1.8M for FY14 for the interdisciplinary Hawai'i Health Systems Corporation Primary Care Training Program at Hilo Medical Center.

• *HB546: Relating to the Hawaii Employer –Union Health Benefits Trust Fund;* The purpose of this measure is to reduce the unfunded liability of the Hawai'i Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund.

• *HR30/HCR48;* The purpose and intent of this measure is to request the University of Hawai`i at Hilo to establish a task force to examine the feasibility of forming a UH Hilo men's volleyball team.

• *SR94/SCR132;* The purpose and intent of this measure is to help disadvantaged youth from the Keaukaha/Panaewa Hawaiian Homes Communities in the Hilo district succeed academically by requesting the University of Hawai'i at Hilo to establish a formal association with the RISE 21st Century After School Program along with joint coordination in an effort to provide early preparation for college readiness.

• *SR98/SCR137;* The purpose of this measure is to request the Coordinator on Homelessness to assemble a working group to identify innovative housing solutions for homeless Native Hawaiian families, to investigate suitable and available federal, state, county, and private land for innovative housing projects, and to prepare a plan to develop a demonstration housing project for homeless Native Hawaiian families that can serve as a model statewide.

Kulani Correctional Facility

In 2009 the Kulani Correctional Facility closed its doors as a cost-saving mechanism initiated by the Lingle Administration. The facility dates back to the 1940's where it was well known throughout the state for its excellent treatment programs and how instrumental these programs were in helping inmates transition back into the general population.

Immediately after assuming the Governorship, Governor Abercrombie debuted his outline for *A New Day in Hawai`i*. One of the headlining initiatives was to reactivate the Kulani Correctional Facility. After years of hard work and dedication on behalf of the Abercrombie Administration, the Legislature has echoed their efforts by appropriating \$2.4M for FY14 and \$5.1M for FY15. In hindsight, re-opening the facility would save the State \$5M annually. The facility is slated to re-open the Summer of 2014.

Lanakila Homes

As a young boy growing up in Hilo in the 1950's I have fond memories of my youth as my 'ohana and I resided in the Lanakila Public Housing Complex.

Over the last 15 years I have watched, as many of you have, as the remaining tract of 60 plus homes known as the "Block 4" have fell into total disrepair and neglect.

With so many of our Hawai'i Island families struggling to find affordable housing, I made the restoration of the Block 4 homes at Lanakila one of my top priorities when I took office. After a collaborative effort with my colleagues, the 2012 legislature appropriated \$7.5M in general obligation bond funds.

I am pleased to announce on April 5, 2013 Governor Abercrombie released the \$7.5M to the Hawai'i Public Housing Authority to initiate the first phase of the restoration of Block 4 at Lanakila Homes. The Abercrombie Administration is dedicated to accelerating Hawai'i's economic recovery through a broad-ranged series of CIPs called the *New Day Projects*.
