Liberty Dialysis Hawai'i



On October 24, 2013 Senator Kahele and Governor Abercrombie paid an unannounced visit to the patients and staff of Liberty Dialysis Center located on 140 Rainbow Drive. The current Liberty Dialysis clinic has 24 dialysis stations serving 184 East Hawai'i residents. The new facility will have 48 dialysis stations doubling the existing capacity and providing easy access to dialysis services for many years to come. The new facility located on 1384 Kinoole St. will officially be open for care on Monday, November 4, 2013.
