## A Message from Senator Kahele

During the 2013 legislative session, Senate Concurrent Resolution 43 (SCR43) easily passed both the Senate and House chambers in March. SCR43 requested the Department of Transportation to recognize the significant accomplishments of the late Senator Daniel K. Inouye by designating Saddle Road as the Daniel K. Inouye Legacy Highway. Saddle Road and the late Senator Inouye represented both literally and symbolically the bridging together of East and West Hawai'i. Saddle Road was rerouted and designed to meet Federal Highway standards and six months after the passing of SCR43, officially opened last month as the *Daniel K. Inouye Highway* and will serve as a reminder to all, present and future, of a man that has done so much for the betterment of the people of Hawai'i Island.

Towards the latter part of September the Senate committees on Ways and Means and Water and Land, along with myself as the Tourism Chair, toured various parts of the state to receive updates and briefings on capitol improvement projects and numerous state investments. These site visits enables the Senators to collaborate and engage with neighbor island officials on issues relating to our state and local communities.

## Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Awareness Day

## Daniel K. Inouye Highway

On September 7, 2013 community members, government officials, and Senator Inouye's Ohana came together on what would have been Senator Inouye's 89th birthday to bless, dedicate and rename Route 200, locally known as Saddle Road, as the Daniel K. Inouye Highway.

The 10.27 mile realignment will cut the Hilo-Kona commute by 15-20 minutes. This means a huge savings in hours spent on the road for our Hawai'i Island residents and most importantly it brings the communities throughout our 4,028 square mile island closer together. ## 68th Anniversary of The End of World War II September 2, 2013, Pearl Harbor

The commemoration ceremony that marked the 68th anniversary of the signing of the Instruments of Surrender of September 2, 1945 was held pier side of the USS Missouri 'Mighty Mo' Memorial.

Following the ceremony was the dedication and unveiling of the statue honoring Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, USN, who directed the War of the Pacific. The nine-foot bronze statue on a black granite pedestal honoring Fleet Admiral Nimitz, was installed next to the Mighty Mo battleship. The statue depicts him as he appeared in battle in 1944. Fleet Admiral Nimitz commanded the largest ocean area and the most ships of any single commander in history.
