Many thanks to Mayor Caldwell and the City Parks Department for their help and partnership with us. Also, kudos to Mililani Middle School **Principal Elynne Chung** who worked with us, the City, MMS staff and families to formulate a workable transition plan. I am so pleased that the Legislature was quick to support the new building and property acquisition to make the plan a reality.



Primary Election Day ~ Saturday, August 11 General Election Day ~ Tuesday, November 6

Make your voice heard!

It's an election year in Hawaii, with primary voting scheduled for Saturday, August 11, and the general election on Tuesday, November 6. We all owe it to our communities, our families and ourselves to vote when we have the opportunity to voice our support for candidates of choice.

The Legislature has moved to improve voter turnout by authorizing online voter registration, voting by mail or at walk-in polling locations ahead of election day, and for the first time this year enabling qualified voters to register at polling places same-day on election day.

Even with same-day voter registration, the Office of Elections is encouraging people to register by July 12 for the August primary and October 9 for the November general election.

Doing so minimizes last-minute rush business and assures that you are on the registered voter lists posted at polling places.
