The Mililani Disaster Preparedness Team was established in 2018 by Mililani resident and retired Brigadier General Braden Sakai with a vision of preparing the Mililani Community in the event of a natural or manmade disaster through disaster response plans. The goal of MDPT's plan is to educate the community and equip them with the tools to work together in the event of a disaster to sustain themselves until help arrives. As the plan continues to be developed, residents are urged to be part of the solution by taking the following preparedness steps to begin laying a strong foundation for your



family and community's emergency plan. Head to the MDPT website for more information or contact Braden Sakai for presentations to prepare your family in case of an emergency:

1. Build a home Disaster Kit for your family that includes 14 days of food and water 2. Take necessary steps to reinforce entryways, windows and strengthen your home 3. Start making a map of your neighborhood so you are aware of evacuation options
