Sopogy 2011 Business Innovation Showcase Winner

Sopogy, Inc. was one of 5 showcase winners that was on display at numerous venues during APEC. Founded in 2002, Sopogy has revolutionized solar thermal technology with MicroCSP, concentrated solar power. They have developed modular collectors about one-third the size of traditional solar units. The units enable effective distributed generation of electricity, process heating and cooling in a single system.

Darren Kimura is Sopogy's President and CEO and also a Mililani Mauka resident. Sopogy is the winner of the 2011 Business Innovation Showcase and has also been awarded winner for Going Green Global 200 for the 3rd year. Sopogy's technology is helping to bring the clean energy goals to light and also create local jobs here in Hawaii.

Sopogy signed a memorandum of understanding on November 13 with Sichuan Dongjia Investment Company which took place at the China Aloha Business Leader's night gala during the APEC week long events.
