Senator Kim initiated a Moanalua Town Hall, held March 25th, to respond to Moanalua constituents and ensure they had a platform to voice their concerns and receive direct responses from key government agencies.

This meeting filled the Moanalua Middle School for a night of meaningful discussion and was the first time she and Councilmember Cordero hosted 14+ panelists from various agencies, including the Office of Congressman Ed Case, Hawaii Fest organizers, JP Damon, and more.

Lively conversations regarding the Hawaii Fest concert, the 5G tower, traffic and speeding on residential streets, and many more concerns took place. A big mahalo to all our guest panelists and to Councilmember Cordero for participating with Senator to make this event possible.

Funding Released for Moanalua's Tennis/Pickle Ball Courts

Last legislative session, Senator Kim laid the groundwork to secure funding for the badly needed renovation, design, and reconstruction of the 4 tennis/8 pickle ball courts at Moanalua High School, plus additional storage space and new equipment. She is happy to report the recent release of \$2,000,000 towards this cause. Over 40,000 people annually utilize Moanalua High School's tennis/pickle ball courts. Senator Kim will continue to support Moanalua High School's winning tennis program as well as all users of this facility. Hats off to Coach Kyle Kaneshiro for his continued advocacy.
