We also opened the 31st Hawaii State Legislature on January 20, 2021 followed by Governor David Ige's State of the State Address on January 25, 2021. The State continues to move forward with COVID-19 vaccination plans. Currently, only seniors ages 75 and above, healthcare workers, and first responders are allowed to register online for the vaccination.
