2022 Session Calendar Highlights

Update on Red Hill Fuel Tank Leak

The Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) finalized its Emergency Order to suspend operations and empty the underground tanks at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility. Deputy Director Marian Tsuji's final order affirmed Hearings Officer David Day's proposed findings and recommendations.

"Today's decision affirms DOH's actions to safeguard the drinking water that we share as a community," said Deputy Director of Environmental Health Kathleen Ho, who issued the Emergency Order on December 6. "In light of today's ruling, we call upon the Navy to act without further delay to address the imminent peril this facility poses to the people and environment of Hawaii."

The parties have 30 days to appeal the final order to the Hawaii Circuit Court. The order will remain in effect unless it is stayed by a court.

FREE COVID-19 Testing Sites

The City and County of Honolulu is providing COVID-19 testing without charge if you meet one of the following criteria: 1) Oahu Residents or 2) City and County of Honolulu Employees. To preregister, go to <u>https://oahucitypass.lumisight.com</u>. Please bring a valid identification card to verify your identity and employment with you to the test. For testing, go to the Daniel K. Inouye International Airport—Diamond Head Tour Group Area just past Baggage Claim 31 (ample parking in the parking structure). Open 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., seven days a week.

As part of the Safe Access Oahu Program, there is also free COVID-19 testing at the Aloha Stadium Marketplace. To register online, go to <u>https://testing.nomihealth.com/easy_registration/172/onsite</u>. They do not accept walk-ins. Bring ID & QR code to your appointment. Call (808) 207-5459 for more information.

The Hawaii Department of Health also offers a program for free Community COVID-19 RT PCR Testing (for U.S. residents only) at various locations, including one conveniently located at Pearl City Shopping Center. To sign up/register, go to <u>https://alohaclear.com/home/department/doh</u>.
