Dear Neighbor,

The welcome news about the pending closure of Red Hill fuel facility dominated the media space with many of our constituents praising this decision by the military. We truly see it as the power of democracy, as the people have spoken strongly, and the authorities listened. We will continue to monitor the situation so the decommissioning of the facility will be done appropriately.

First Crossover took place on March 10, 2022. I am happy to report that 18 of my bills have crossed over to the House for their consideration. Only about 25% of the bills introduced typically survive the First Crossover deadline.

Lastly, I would like to share that I have introduced 24 resolutions that address a variety of community concerns. For a full listing, please see the attached addendum.

Governor Ige Announces Target Date to End Mask Requirement

The statewide indoor mask requirement will end when the current emergency proclamation related to COVID-19 expires at 11:59 p.m. on March 25, 2022. "Together, we have reduced COVID-19 in Hawai'i to the point where most of us will be safe without masks indoors," said Gov. Ige. "Right now, hospitalizations are trending down. Case counts are falling. We are better at treating people who are infected. Booster shots are saving lives. And the CDC has rated the state's COVID-19 community level as "low". However, the state will be ready to reinstitute the mask policy if COVID case numbers surge."
