Child Protective Act; Aggravated Circumstances	Amends the definition of "aggravated circumstances" in chap- ter 587A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to make it consistent with the federal Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act and the state plan under Title IV-E of the Social Security Act. (HB2533 HD1)
	ACT 35	RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT. Child Support Enforcement	Includes the date that services for remuneration were first performed as information to be provided to the Child Support Enforcement Agency through the new hire reporting process. Establishes notice and time limit requirements for employers or unions in receipt of notice regarding health insurance for a dependent child. (HB2441 HD2)
	ACT 41	PETRATOR CHECKS FOR CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.	Allows the Department of Human Services to conduct adult abuse perpetrator checks on providers, license-exempt pursu- ant to section 346-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that care for children receiving child care subsidies from the department, applicants who want to operate a child care facility, prospec- tive employees of the applicant, licensed child care providers, and new employees of the registered or licensed provider. (HB2539 HD1)
	ACT 68	RELATING TO LIMITATION OF ACTIONS. Limitation of Actions; Sexual Of- fenses Against Minors	Extends the statute of limitations for civil actions brought by persons subjected to sexual offenses as a minor against the person who committed the act. Revives for a two-year period certain actions for which the statute of limitations had previ- ously lapsed. Authorizes a court to award attorney's fees to a defendant when an accusation of sexual abuse was made with no basis in fact and with malicious intent. (SB2588 HD3)
	ACT 76	RELATING TO COMPREHENSIVE OFFENDER REENTRY SYSTEM.	Establishes the Offender Reentry Office within the Depart- ment of Public Safety to address the goals of Chapter 353H, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Reconstitutes the Reentry Commis- sion under Act 24, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, with the added duty to ensure that the Comprehensive Offender Reentry System is implemented as soon as practicable. Ex- tends sunset of Reentry Commission to December 1, 2015. Effective July 1, 2012. (SB2866 HD2)
	ACT 92	RELATING TO HEALTH INSUR- ANCE. Mammogram Insurance Cover- age; Referrals	Prohibits an insurer from requiring a doctor's referral for an- nual covered screening mammograms for insured persons forty years of age and older. Effective July 1, 2012. (SB2084 HD1)
