Contraflow Test Coming to Highway 130

From **April 30 to May 11, 2018**, Hawaii Dept of Transportation (HDoT) Hawaii District will be running a trial for morning northbound traffic on Keaau-Pahoa Road (Highway 130). A contraflow lane will be created from Kaloli Drive to Shower Drive from 6-9 a.m. The contraflow is for the makai lane so there will be 2 lanes heading to Hilo from Shower to Kaloli during this period.

During the test run, there will be NO left turn from Hwy 130 to Shower and NO left turn from 29th (Poni Moi) to Hwy 130. HDoT will shuttle pedestrians and bicyclists through the affected area. Designated pickups and drop off areas for these services will be north of Shower Drive and south of Kaloli Drive. Hawaii District staff will be on site throughout the test.

Aloha! Here are some highlights of the state budget • for fiscal year 2019. The total budget is below. The information is subject to change.

The highlights for Puna and nearby areas include:

- \$10.3 million for Hawaii Community Correctional
 Facility;
- \$250,000 for Puna Agricultural Park;
- \$712 million for Daniel K. Inouye Hwy. Extension to Queen Kaahumanu;
- \$12.4 million for Wastewater Treatment Revolving Fund;
- \$2 million for Hilo Medical Center
- \$5 million for Ohana Zones

- \$500,000 for Pahoa High and Middle School Playcourt
- \$1 million for Pahoa High and Intermediate, Covered Walkway
- \$500,000 Pahoa High and Intermediate, Track & Field Ground
