Some of what I've been doing this interim

- Walked through Pahoa High/Intermediate and elementary schools; and Keonepoko with DoE engineers to see their needs. Pahoa Intermediate badly needs a covered playcourt and Pahoa Elementary badly needs a cafeteria so that children need not walk across the street to Pahoa High for meals.
- Attended World Conservation Congress, Hawaii tourism conference and met with various community volunteers on ecological concerns how climate change has effected our policies; and the needs to reforest; prevent spread of Rapid-Ohia Death, etc.
- Attended policy workshop with the Dept of Trans concerning the Road Usage Charge & the next day at HAAS regarding student safety.



- Received assurance from Ed Sniffen, Deputy Director that a crosswalk with signs will be set up as long as the school provides crossing guards. Crosswalk with signs has since been created.
- Met with Dan Brinkman, Regional CEO and HHSC corporate board member of Hilo Medical Center (HMC) who confirmed that HMC wants Puna Community Medical Center (PCMC) to succeed. HMC will help PCMC get through the paperwork needed to keep PCMC afloat and ensure that Department of Health releases the funds set aside for the design of an emergency room.
- Attended Wireless U Communications Policy Seminar to find out how other rural states get broadband. I've also spoken with Representative's from Verizon, Oceanic and HawaiianTelCom to find out their plans for lower Puna.
- Spoke with Kekoa Kaluhia, first deputy of Department of Land and Natural Resource (DLNR), and will
 continue to talk to DLNR, along with other community leaders, to see if something can be done about the
 Pohoiki boat ramp/swimming area and whether a State park should be created in Kapoho/Kahena
 Beach.
- Attended Governor Ige's information session about grant disbursement policy to ensure that the money we allocated for in the legislative process actually gets disbursed.
- Met with the two medical marijuana licensees and I was happy to hear that they both want to provide high -quality lab-tested affordable products and want to provide high-paying jobs.
