At the conference where HDOT explained a proposed pilot project that would replace gas taxes with road usage taxes. For more information http://HawaiiTribune-Herald, http://start advertiser and/or http://hidot.hawaii.gov/. Oregon will fully implement it and 14 other states (mostly western) have either completed or are implementing pilot projects. New Zealand has already implemented it. They found that people in rural areas actually paid less tax because they usually have less fuel-efficient vehicles. It's a way to ensure that all vehicles that use the road pay their fair share. Be ready to comment when this bill is in the 2017 legislative session.

A. NO, Hawaii is one of six states that do **NOT** allow for any "write-in"s. Doing so spoils the ballot and invalidates the portion of your ballot that has been written on. Checking off too many boxes, spoils your ballot.
