TOP UPDATES:

STAY-AT-HOME ORDER MANDATED FOR HAWAII STATE BY GOVERNER DAVID IGE

Effective 12:01 a.m. HST, Wednesday, March 25, 2020 through April 30, 2020 a Stay-at-Home Order will be enforced for the State of Hawaii via a supplement to the Emergency Proclamation issued by Governor David Ige.

HAWAII INCOME TAX PAYMENT AND FILING DEADLINES FOR TAX YEAR 2019 POSTPONED

Individual income tax returns and payments for the 2019 taxable year that are due from April 20, 2020 to June 20, 2020 are now due by July 20, 2020. This relief applies to all individual income tax filers, including self-employed individuals. The Department of Taxation will automatically provide this relief, there is no need to file additional forms to qualify for this relief. Individual Income Taxpayers expecting a refund should file as soon as possible. They are granted an automatic extension to file by October 20, 2020.

MANDATORY QUARANTINE OF ALL TRAVELERS INTO HAWAII

Effective, 12:01 a.m. HST Thursday, March 26, 2020, Governor David Ige has ordered that all persons entering the State of Hawai'i to self-quarantine for 14 days or for the duration of their stay in Hawai'i, whichever is shorter.



GRAB-AND-GO MEAL SERVICE FOR STUDENTS AT PAHOA HIGH & INTERMEDIATE AND MORE

During the extended closure of community schools, HI Dept. of Education will continue to provide student meals, including providing grab-and-go breakfast and lunch at select schools to children 18 years and under at the following days and times: Monday through Friday from 7:30

a.m. to 8 a.m. for breakfast; 11:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. for lunch. A list of the pick-up sites is available <u>here.</u>

FILE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ONLINE - 1 WEEK WAITING PERIOD WAIVED

The safest, and most efficient way to apply for unemployment benefits is through the new webform at <u>https://huiclaims.hawaii.gov/#/</u>. The State will backdate claims and deposit unemployment benefits for eligible individuals that were unable to file their claims due to the overload on the online filing system. Individuals filing claims will need an account for depositing funds into (savings or checking), financial institution routing number, and an account number. To be best prepared, please have the contact information and dates of employment for all of your employers over the past 18 months.

STATE SETS UP CALL CENTER TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE FOR UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMANTS

The Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR) announced the availability of two phone numbers to help process unemployment claims while working on fixing the current online claims filing process. The phone numbers will be available during normal business hours of 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

DEMOCRATIC PARTY OF HAWAII CANCELS WALK-IN PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ON APRIL 4

The Democratic Party of Hawaii has decided to cancel the walk-in voting for the PPP (Presidential Primary Poll) on April 4. Mail-in ballots will be sent to registered Hawaii Democratic Party voters. (Note: The Republican Party has decided not to hold a Presidential primary). More info <u>here</u>.

77 COVID-19 CASES IN HAWAII AS OF MARCH 23, 2020

March 23 (57th - 77th case): There are two new cases on Hawaii Island, two new on Maui, 12 new on Oahu, five infected while at unknown locations. March 22 (49th – 56th case): Six new cases on Oahu, and two on Maui. March 21 (38th – 48th case): There are 10 new positive cases, 7 on Oahu, 2 on Maui and <u>2 on Hawaii Island</u> brings the total to 48. March 20 (27th – 37th case): 11 new cases, 10 on Oahu and one on Kauai. March 19 (17th – 26th case): Eight new cases on Oahu. One of the Oahu cases is state Senator Clarence Nishihara which has led to the closure of the State Capitol for cleaning. Two new positive cases on Maui.

HAWAII ISLAND LEGISLATORS UNITE TO URGE MAYOR KIM TO SHUT DOWN THE ISLAND

After a morning teleconference with fellow Hawaii Isle Legislators, organized by Sen. Kaiali'i Kahele, we agreed on a statement for the County Council emergency hearing today. Per Bruce Anderson at today's hearing, he believes the Governor is seriously considering more stringent models like other states' shut down models.

Re: Request for Immediate Action in Response to the Public Health Concerns Regarding Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Dear Mayor Kim,

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To protect the residents of the County of Hawai'i and the long-term stability of our island economy, we implore you to immediately order the shut-down of non-essential county government operations and the sheltering-in-place of all people throughout the County of Hawai'i.

As Mayor of the County of Hawai'i, we strongly urge you to take the following immediate actions through an Emergency Proclamation and Emergency Rule(s):

Institute an immediate countywide shut down for the next fifteen (15) days.

Order all people in the County of Hawai'i to shelter-in-place for the next 15 days
and coordinate with the Joint Incident Center under the command of the Hawai'i
Emergency Management Agency Director/Adjutant General Kenneth Hara to immediately
use his authority under the March 16, 2020, Emergency Supplementary Proclamation by
Governor Ige to take all necessary steps and required means to ensure that the supply chain
for basic necessities -- such as food, medicine, water, communications, gasoline, cargo and
public safety throughout the County of Hawai'i -- is secure.

 Request Director/Adjutant General Hara to secure and requisition any needed hospital and medical supplies that are necessary to assist with the coming need to treat individuals due to COVID-19, at all available Hawai'i Island medical facilities. > In coordination with Governor Ige, order the quarantine of all travelers arriving from outside Hawai'i at the Hilo and Kona International Airports for a minimum of 15 days.

· Prohibit all non-essential inter-island and out-of-state travel from Hawai'i Island.

 In coordination with Governor Ige, require the immediate closure of all public and private schools, daycare centers, preschools, the University of Hawai'i at Hilo, Hawai'i Community College and Hawai'i Community College Palananui.

Require the immediate closure of all County facilities and workspaces, and send
home all non-essential County of Hawai'i personnel for the duration of the shut down.

 Limit County of Hawai'i work to only essential personnel, provided they are equipped with the proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and adhere to spatial distancing guidelines and preventive measures as recommended by the Center for Disease Control and Hawai'i Department of Health.

As Mayor, you are the only person who has the direct authority to institute these actions. As state legislators, we passed and continue to support the delegated authority provided to the counter under Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) Chapter 127, which grants you, as Mayor, the power to act in emergency situations such as the unprecedented one we face today. The entire Hawai'i Island delegation is speaking with one collective voice, and we implore you to take immediate action for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the County of Hawai'i.
