RAISED CROSSWALKS

PROCEDURES AND PROTOCOLS OF A SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS BY VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS, AGENCIES, AND VOLUNTEERS IN MAUI COUNTY

MAUI POLICE DEPARTMENT (MPD)

After a call comes into the 911 dispatcher the following actions are taken:

Preliminary information is gathered:

- Missing person's age, height, weight, hair and eye color, marital status
- Last known clothing worn
- Medical conditions (physical or mental) requiring immediate attention
- Scars/marks/tattoos or other characteristics which may aid in locating and/or identifying the person
- Last known contact/location seen, etc.
- Areas known to frequent
- Recent photograph(s) of person
- If person is in possession of any vehicle

Checks will be made to ascertain if missing person is incarcerated or confined in a medical facility.

* MPD ACTION

- An All-Points Bulletin (APB) will be issued.
- Press Release will be issued (to media outlets and on <u>MPD's Facebook page</u>) *For rescues that are assigned to other agencies (MFD, Coast Guard, etc.) they will issue the press release.
- MPD will conduct a search of area the victim was last seen.
- MFD's helicopter will be utilized to assist in the search (Coast Guard and MFD usually conduct a search for 3 days)
- MPD's canine tracking dog(s) will be utilized.
- If weather conditions permit, MPD's Drone Team will be deployed.

Maui Search and Rescue is contacted to assist with the search efforts.

MAUI SEARCH and RESCUE (MSR)

Is a volunteer organization that provides free expert search and rescue assistance and community outreach.

They respond to call-outs from government agencies and in situations where government agencies have not or cannot be immediately activated.

MAUI COUNTY FIRE AND PUBLIC SAFETY (MFD)

The Department of Fire and Public Safety provides emergency and non-emergency services for the islands of Maui, Moloka'i, Lāna'i, and Kaho'olawe and surrounding waters.

Fire and Rescue Operations is responsible for <u>emergency</u> response. Their technical rescues are ones in the Ocean, Mountain, Confined Space and Body Recovery.

Fire and Public Safety responds to 911 calls from the Police dispatcher (called HUB) or may respond to a solid lead if it's not an immediate 911 call.

After receiving the call from the dispatcher, based upon the scenario they will send out the appropriate team: land-Fire Dept, ocean-Lifeguard-Fire Dept., boats-Fire Dept. and/or Coast Guard or a combination of departments and determines how many to send out and the type of equipment.

US COAST GUARD

The Coast Guard is responsible for maritime search and rescue operations, this includes the domestic and international waters surrounding Hawaii.

A search may be initiated by a distress call or a call from a County Police or Fire Department or voluntary search party.

The Coast Guard is equipped for both marine and air searches.
