# **Do you have Unclaimed Property?**

Did you know the State of Hawaii holds unclaimed property as a custodian for the rightful owner? Have you checked to see if you or your Tutu who has passed have unclaimed property? Many of us do and don't even realize it. Some have few cents to a few hundred or even a few thousand dollars. It is very easy to check, and you can do it yourself from home.

Please view the information at the link/ QR Code below to check if you, your family members, or even your business/organization (past or present) have any unclaimed property. The list is updated every year. If you have unclaimed property, all you have to do is fill out the forms and get them turned in to the Unclaimed Property Office.

No fees and no lawyers are needed.



**REMINDER:** Act 184, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014 requires that claims for funds less than \$100 in the unclaimed property trust fund must be claimed within ten (10) years of deposit into the trust fund, or the funds will escheat to the State and be transferred to the general fund. On July 1, 2024, unclaimed funds less than \$100 and received on or prior to June 30, 2014, will escheat to the State if not claimed.

# Senator DeCoite's Bills that have passed through the Legislature and moving onto the Governor

### SB2497 SD2 HD1 CD1 RELATING TO TAXATION

Repeals the provision that made references to the base amount in the Internal Revenue Code inapplicable to the research activities tax credit and allowed credits for all qualified research expenses to be taken without regard to previous years' expenses. Narrows the qualifying criteria for research activities tax credits to applicants who are small businesses registered in the State. Amends the maximum amount of tax credits that can be certified per year. Extends the sunset date of the research activities tax credit to 12/31/29

### SB2537 SD2 HD1 CD1 RELATING TO ENERGY

Clarifies that the Chief Energy Officer is responsible for supporting the renewable portfolio standards and reporting on certain energy matters.

# **2024 BILLS OF IMPORTANCE**

### SB1035 SD2 HD1 CD1 **RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX**

Exempts from the general excise tax those medical and dental services provided by health care providers to patients who receive Medicaid, Medicare, or TRICARE benefits

## HB2619 HD1 SD1 CD1 **RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL BIOSECURITY**

Requires the Department of Agriculture to lead and coordinate the State's invasive pest control and eradication biosecurity efforts. Establishes certain reporting requirements. Appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture for programs and positions in agricultural biosecurity. Appropriates funds to each county as a grant-in-aid, subject to a county match, for the implementation of feral chicken control programs.

#### SB2974 SD2 HD1 CD1 RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Establishes a Business Revitalization Task Force within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to identify methods to improve Hawaii's general economic competitiveness and business climate, including the mitigation of regulatory and tax burdens. Requires a report to the Legislature.

### SB2536 SD1 HD1 CD1 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT PREFERENCES AND RECIPROCITY

Establishes accounting services procurement preferences for certain Hawaii accounting service businesses. Clarifies that the existing reciprocity procurement preference includes. offerors under sections 103D-302 and 103D-303, Hawaii Revised Statutes

### HB2074 HD2 SD1 CD1 RELATING TO KAIAPUNI EDUCATION.

Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for Kaiapuni programs and the establishment of three full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) Kaiapuni education curriculum specialist II positions and ten full-time equivalent (10.0 FTE) Kaiapuni classroom teacher positions.

# SB2475 SD2 HD2 CD1 RELATING TO EDUCATION

Establishes a harm to students registry, for all early learning programs or schools and K-12 educational institutions within the State, that contains information on school employees, contractors, or volunteers for whom, as result of an investigation, a final finding has been issued that the individual has inflicted harm on a student.

# HB2404 HD1 SD1 CD1 RELATING TO INCOME TAX

Incrementally increases standard deduction amounts and widens income tax brackets for specific taxable years beginning after 12/31/2023.

# WHAT'S NEXT? Governor's Deadlines, CIP Releases and 2024 Awarded GIA's

### For Bills sent to the Governor after April 15, 2024 (less than 20 days prior to adjournment sine die)...

- 1) If the Governor signs the bill by **July 10, 2024** (the 45th day after adjournment *sine die*), the bill becomes law and is given an act number.
- 2) If the Governor neither signs nor vetoes the bill by **July 10**, 2024 (the 45th day after adjournment sine die), the bill becomes law without the Governor's signature and is given an act number
- 3) If the Governor intends to veto the bill, the Governor must inform the Legislature by June 25, 2024 (the 35th day after adjournment sine die) and deliver the veto by July 10, 2024 (the 45th day after adjournment *sine die*). If the bill is vetoed, it will not become law unless the Legislature successfully overrides the veto in special session by a 2/3 vote in each

chamber. The Legislature must convene in special session at or before noon on July 10, 2024, to override the Governor's veto.
