What does it mean? Watches, Warnings, and Advisories

- Hurricane/Tropical Storm Watch: Hurricane/Tropical Storm conditions are possible within 48 hours.
- Hurricane/Tropical Storm Warning: Hurricane/Tropical Storm conditions are expected within 36 hours.
- **Flood Advisory:** Be aware of a potential weather event that could cause nuisance flooding (e.g., ponding on roads, slippery driving conditions).
- **Flood Watch:** Be prepared for the possibility of hazardous weather. A Flood Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for flooding.
- Flash Flood Warning: Take action, flooding is imminent (within 1-6 hrs) or is already occurring. Get to high ground if you're in a flood prone area.
- **Tsunami Advisory:** Issued when a tsunami with potential to generate strong currents or waves dangerous to those in or very near the water is imminent, expected, or occurring.
- **Tsunami Watch:** Issued by Pacific Tsunami Warning Center (PTWC) after distant earthquakes with potential to create a tsunami in Hawaii.
- **Tsunami Warning:** Issued whenever tsunami waves have been confirmed by PTWC and/or a damaging wave is detected.
- **Urgent Local Tsunami Warning:** Issued when a local earthquake has occurred and damaging waves are probable. Wave travel time may be as short as 10-20 minutes.

Emergency Kit Suggestions

7 days of food, water and medications

- 1 gallon of water per person, per day
- Non perishable food (canned soups and other nutritionally balanced canned meals are good)
- Manual can opener

Battery or solar powered radio, flashlight and extra batteries for both

Important documents (in sealed plastic bag)

- Identification (passport, driver's license)
- Debit and credit card information
- Banking information (account numbers, billpay information) this can help avoid credit problems due to inability to make payments during a disaster
- All insurance information
- Healthcare directives
- Copy of property titles/deeds
- Copy of prescriptions and dosages
- Phone list of family and important numbers
