Aloha District 13,

It is a true honor to return to the capitol this year to represent ALL of you!

I return to the Capitol energized and ready to work. My new role as Vice Chair of the House Committee on Agriculture has already been rewarding. In early January I was invited to attend the '2017 Legislative Agriculture Chairs Summit' in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where I participated in workshops and attended lectures focusing on endangered and invasive species, the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA), climate change and local food production to name a few. This summit helped me clarify the need for some bills that I've been working on and also gave me some new ideas to work on.

On the next two pages of this newsletter you'll see the 21 bills I have introduced for this session. Amongst these bills you will see focuses on:

- <u>Protecting our Youth</u> by aiming on anti-bullying and suicide prevention in our schools.
- <u>Education funding</u> for our schools by exempting our rural schools from the Weighted Student Formula.
- <u>Environment</u> looking at effect of sunscreen and sewage on our coral.
- Hawaiian Affairs. Revisiting reducing the blood quantum for DHHL successors to 1/32, which was the original request of Prince Jonah Kuhio to congress in 1920. And appropriating funds to the University of Hawai'i to translate the Ha-

wai'i State Constitution into the Hawaiian language.

♦ <u>Agriculture</u> focusing on Invasive Species Prevention, Pesticide Use, Local Food Production and Food Safety.

I will also be continuing work on Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) for our district. Working with the Governor to get funds released and also getting new project funds awarded. Amongst these projects the priorities are upgrades for our schools across the district (on all 3 islands) along with safety improvements for our roadways.

My staff and I work hard to make sure you are all informed of what is going on here at the Capitol. We post updates to social media (Facebook and Twitter) and also send out Email Updates highlighting public events in the district, news and opportunities that may be of interest to you, along with notices of public hearings that are taking place at the State Capitol that directly affect District 13.

Education; Weighted Student Formula; Remote Schools; Appropriations Exempts remote schools from the weighted student formula. Provides that remote schools will be funded based on categorical allotments that guar-antee the funding of a minimum number of instructional and support staff positions to ensure that at least minimum course requirements are main-tained. Defines "remote school." Makes appropriations. **Committee Referral:** EDN, FIN <u>3 Steps to Advocating for bills!</u>

1. **Request a Hearing:** The first step in advocating for a bill is to write to the Chair of the committee and request a hearing for the bill(s) you're advocating for.

2. **Submit Testimony:** The next step is if/when the bill gets a hearing, submit your testimony to the committee or through the capitol website (<u>www.capitol.hawaii.gov</u>). You may also want to encourage your friends and community members to submit their testimony as well. If possible, come to the Capitol for the hearing.

3. **Rest and Repeat:** If the bill is referred to more than one committee than you need to request hearings and submit testimony for each committee as the bill moves forward. * Keep in mind once House Bills (HB) crossover to the Senate and Senate Bills (SB) crossover to the House the <u>process starts over again</u>.
