Students are also invited to participate in a short training session conducted by the Public Access Room which will be held from 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. in Room 224. The purpose of the Public Access Room (a division of the Legislative Reference Bureau) and its services is to make the Legislature more accessible to Hawaii's citizens. Participating students will also be introduced from the Senate Gallery.

Attached are suggestions on how to select and track a Bill of interest to the student, and write and submit testimony. Additional information will be sent to participating students.

Selecting a Bill for Testimony

Students submitting the attached participation form will be sent, **via email**, a list of House Bills that are still alive and have a chance to "cross over" to the Senate on March 8, 2012. House Bills that successfully cross over to the Senate will probably be among the ones being heard at the Senate Education Committee hearing on Friday, March 16.

Tracking a Bill

Once the student has selected a Bill of interest from the list sent via email:

- 1. Go to the Hawaii State Legislature's website: <u>http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov</u>
- 2. On the right hand side of the web page, click on "House."
- 3. On the left hand side under "Bill status/Measure status," type in the Bill title, e.g., "hb2007" with no spaces or periods.
- 4. Print out a copy of the most recent version of the Bill.

Writing Testimony

- 1. Read the Bill carefully, do some research and select a stance: Support or Oppose the Bill.
- 2. Write testimony that explains the reasons for your position. You should support your position with research.
- 3. Limit the testimony to one page or less. Concise, clearly stated positions will have a bigger impact on the Senators than long, repetitious testimony. Students from the same school testifying on the same Bill should have different reasons for supporting or opposing the Bill. Bring a copy of the written testimony with you.

Submitting Testimony

24 hours PRIOR to the hearing: By Thursday, March 15, 2012, submit testimony before 1:15 p.m. in one of the following ways:

By Email: Testimony may be emailed if less than 5 pages in length, to the Committee at <u>EDUTestimony@Capitol.hawaii.gov</u>. Please indicate the measure, date and time of the hearing. Email sent to individual offices or any other Senate office will not be accepted.

By Web: Testimony may be submitted online if less than 10MB in size, at <u>http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov</u> Click on the "Submit Testimony" icon in the center of the page. Type in the Bill number (for example, "hb2007") and hit "submit." Confirm that this is the correct hearing by clicking on "View Notice." If correct, follow the directions under "Enter Information" and upload your testimony file.

If you require special assistance or auxiliary aids or services to participate in the public hearing process (i.e., sign or foreign language interpreter or wheelchair accessibility), please contact the committee clerk 24 hours prior to the hearing so arrangements can be made.

To Get the Final Hearing Notice for March 16, 2012

- 1. Go to the Hawaii State Legislature's website: http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov
- On the left side under "Hearings by Date," enter the date in mm/dd/yy format: "03/16/12" and hit "Go."
- 3. Under "Hearing Notices" below "Committee," scroll down to "EDU."
- 4. On the right side, click on "See It" to get the Senate Education Committee hearing notice.
