## LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

We are approaching the Second Crossover deadline at the Legislature where all bills return to their original body to agree or disagree to amendments made by the opposite body.

Act 5 (Senate Bill 8), signed into law by the Governor on March 14, 2011, gives the Governor the authority to appoint nine members to the Hawaii State Board of Education, which would consist of: one member from the county of Hawaii, one member from the county of Maui, one member from the county of Kauai, 3 members from the city and county of Honolulu, and three at-large-members; provided that the Governor select an at-large member as the chairperson. The Senate Education Committee held its confirmation hearing for the first half of the appointees on April 6th. The second hearing will take place on April 8th. The full Senate will take a floor vote to confirm the members based on the recommendations of the Education Committee.

The Senate Ways and Means Committee passed out HB200 Relating to the State Budget on April 5th. The Senate version of the bill includes Capital Improvement Project (CIP) amounts for various projects in Senate District 24, including.

- Enchanted Lake Elementary - \$1.4 Million for campus wide electrical upgrades
- Kailua High - \$2.5 Million for the plans, design, construction of the removal and replacement of the football/soccer fields bleachers and storage rooms
- Kalaheo High - \$1.5 Million for the plans, design, and construction for improvements to the athletic field.
- Kaneohe Elementary - \$400,000 for the plans, design, and construction of portable classroom
- Puohala Elementary - \$250,000 for plans and designs for structural assessment of the separation of walls on campus
- Kaneohe Public Library - \$20,000 for plans, design, and construction for new ADA compliant circulation desk.
- Coconut Island - \$700,000 for plans, construction and equipment to demolish the Pauley guest house and residence
- Kawainui Marsh - \$350,000 for plans, design, and construction for Forestry and Wildlife Baseyard Facilities improvements
- Hawaii State Hospital - \$11.6 Million for design and construction for various repairs


