

2011 Opening Day at the Hawaii State Capitol

On January 19, 2011, the first legislative floor session of the year convened at the Hawaii State Capitol for Opening Day of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature. A departure from Opening Day 2010, this year's ceremony included traditional pomp and circumstance, complete with flowers, song and dance. "I felt it was important we set a positive tone for the upcoming session and welcome our new Senators in the traditional celebratory fashion" said Senate President Tsutsui.

Floor session was called to order at 10am then proceeded with an opening prayer, the National Anthem and Hawai'i Pono'i by Mr. Danny Kaleikini. After administration of the Oath of Office to the new members, Senate President Tsutsui delivered remarks addressing the work that lay before the Legislature this session as well as his positive attitude toward the future. In his message Senate President noted that "Balancing the needs of today with one eye on the future will be critical," but "better days are ahead."

After the Senate President's message, Senators, guests and members of the public were entertained by the Kamehameha School Choir, Society of Seven and Willie K. Guests in attendance included Governor Neil Abercrombie, Lieutenant Governor Brian Schatz, county officials from across the State, as well as former Governors George Ariyoshi, John Waihee, Ben Cayetano and Linda Lingle. Following the close of session, Senate President Tsutsui hosted public refreshments of Okuhara Saimin and Nu'uanu Okazuya Teriyaki Beef Sticks in room 409.
